Resources Inspiring Student Excellence or RISE is a yearlong peer mentoring program designed to connect a first-year student with an upperclassman. This year, RISE mentors and mentees participated in numerous social and campus related events, academic and personal development workshops, teambuilding activities, and cultural field trips.

Events included campus-wide activities like the Cross Cultural Barbeque, where student members from different cultural clubs gave an overview of their student organization and performances representing their respective culture.
